UNFINISHED BUSINESS.

- a. Rice Lake CIP Construction Contracts Approval. The District received the signed award contracts (Notice of Award, Construction Proposal, Construction Agreement, Contractor's Bond on Construction, Liability Insurance) on April 22, 2021 and forwarded them to Attorney Skoyles for review. A pre-construction meeting will be held in the next couple of weeks, with construction to start in mid-May. Motion to approve the Rice Lake Project Construction award contracts (Notice of Award, Construction Proposal, Construction Agreement, Contractor's Bond on Construction, Liability Insurance) to Williams Excavation and Seeding, LLC in the amount of \$501,499.27 for the Rice Lake Upper Structure Project (Kral, Jasken); Roll Call Vote: Kral-AYE; Imholte AYE; Okeson-AYE; Michaelson-AYE; Jasken-AYE; Haggart AYE; Deede-AYE; carried unanimously, attached hereto.
- b. PRWD Citizen Advisory Committee. Moses reviewed the committee's recommended education activities for PRWD financial assistance. Moses suggested the District financially sponsor the Sucker Creek event for 9th grade students and contribute to the City of Detroit Lakes 4th grade Water Festival as both events are well run with PRWD staff participation. There is great interest in pollinator gardens from both school groups and as environmental projects for organized groups. Funding for environmental field trips and classroom science kits were also discussed. Project sponsorship recognition using signage, stickers, news and social media outlets, as well as other methods to promote the District's contribution are required. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING AGREEMENT

This agreement (Agreement) is made and entered into by and between:

The Counties of Otter Tail, and Becker by and through their respective County Board of Commissioners, and The East Otter Tail, West Otter Tail, and Becker Soil and Water Conservation Districts, by and through their respective Soil and Water Conservation District Board of Supervisors, and

The Pelican River and Cormorant Lakes Watershed Districts, by and through their respective Board of Managers, Collectively referred to as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, the Counties of this Agreement are political subdivisions of the State of Minnesota, with authority to carry out environmental programs and land use controls, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 375 and as otherwise provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the Soil and Water Conservation Districts (SWCDs) of this Agreement are political subdivisions of the State of Minnesota, with statutory authority to carry out erosion control and other soil and water conservation programs, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 103C and as otherwise provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the Watershed Districts of this Agreement are political subdivisions of the State of Minnesota, with statutory authority to carry out conservation of the natural resources of the state by land use controls, flood control, public drainage systems authority, and other conservation projects for the protection of the public health and welfare and the provident use of the natural resources, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapters 103B, 103D, 103E and as otherwise provided by law; and

WHEREAS, with matters that relate to coordination of water management authorities pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapters 103B, 103C, and 103D with public drainage systems pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 103E, this Agreement does not change the rights or obligations of the public drainage system authorities; and

WHEREAS, the parties to this Agreement have a common interest and statutory authority to prepare, adopt, and assure implementation of a comprehensive watershed management plan in the Otter Tail River Watershed to conserve soil and water resources through the implementation of practices, programs, and regulatory controls that effectively prevent or minimize the transport of sediment, excess nutrients and bacteria and related pollution into surface waters; mitigate altered hydrology and minimize localized flooding and damages; protect and enhance water quality, ensure continued soil productivity, and protect and preserve groundwater quantity and quantity.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes§ 1038.101, Subd. 14, the Board of Water and Soil Resources (BWSR) "may adopt resolutions, policies, or orders that allow a comprehensive plan, local water management plan, or watershed management plan, developed or amended, approved and adopted, according to chapter 1038, 103C, or 103D to serve as substitutes for one another or be replaced with a comprehensive watershed management plan," also known as the "One Watershed, One Plan".

WHEREAS, it is understood by all the parties to this Agreement that the development and subsequent adoption of a Otter Tail One Watershed One Plan does not replace or supplant individual local land use, planning, zoning authority, but, instead, provides a framework to provide increased opportunities for cooperation and consistency on a watershed basis.

WHEREAS, the Parties have formed this Agreement for the specific goal of developing a plan pursuant to Minnesota Statutes § 103B.801, Comprehensive Watershed Management Planning, also known as *One Watershed, One Plan* that will be consistent with the Parties adopted 10-year Water Management Plans (WMP), and which will not replace, but

will supplement WMP's by better defining how the Parties will carry out certain program activities within their discretion, and which the Parties will apply in accordance with WMP goals, priorities and procedures. Furthermore, it is understood by all parties of this Agreement, that the development and adoption of the plan does not replace or supplant individual local land use, planning, zoning authority, but, instead, provides a framework to provide increased opportunities for cooperation and consistency on a watershed basis.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. Purpose: The Parties to this Agreement recognize the importance of partnerships to plan and implement protection and restoration efforts for the Otter Tail River Watershed, see attached exhibit A. The purpose of this Agreement is to collectively develop and adopt, as local government units, a coordinated watershed management plan, which will not replace, but will supplement the Parties adopted Water Management Plans (WMP's) by better defining how the Parties will carry out certain program activities within its discretion, and which the Parties will apply in accordance with WMP goals, priorities, and procedures. The plan does not replace or supplant individual local land use, planning, zoning authority, but, instead, provides a framework to provide increased opportunities for cooperation and consistency on a watershed basis. Parties signing this agreement will be collectively referred to as the Otter Tail Watershed Partnership (Partnership).
- Term: This Agreement is effective upon signature of all Parties in consideration of the Board of Water and Soil
 Resources (BWSR) Operating Procedures for One Watershed, One Plan; and will remain in effect until adoption
 of the plan by all parties unless canceled according to the provisions of this Agreement or earlier terminated by
 law.
- 3. Adding Additional Parties: A qualifying party within the Otter Tail One Watershed One Plan boundary that is responsible for water planning and resource management according to MN Statutes desiring to become a member of this Agreement shall indicate its intent by adoption of a board resolution prior to 6/30/21. The party will not have voting authority until 90 days after adopting a resolution to become a member of this Agreement. The party agrees to abide by the terms and conditions of the Agreement; including but not limited to the bylaws, policies and procedures adopted by the Policy Committee.
- 4. Withdrawal of Parties: A party desiring to leave the membership of this Agreement shall indicate its intent in writing to the Policy Committee in the form of an official board resolution. Notice must be made at least 30 days in advance of leaving the Agreement. A party that leaves the membership of the Agreement remains obligated to complying with the terms of any grants the Otter Tail One Watershed One Plan has at the time of the party's notice to leave membership and is obligated until the grant has ended.

5. General Provisions:

- a. **Compliance with Laws/Standards:** The Parties agree to abide by all federal, state, and local laws; statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations now in effect or hereafter adopted pertaining to this Agreement or to the facilities, programs, and staff for which the Agreement is responsible.
- b. **Indemnification:** Each party to this Agreement shall be liable for the acts of its officers, employees or agents and the results thereof to the extent authorized or limited by law and shall not be responsible for

the acts of any other party, its officers, employees or agents. The provisions of the Municipal Tort Claims Act, Minnesota Statute Chapter 466 and other applicable laws govern liability of the Parties. To the full extent permitted by law, actions by the Parties, their respective officers, employees, and agents pursuant to this Agreement are intended to be and shall be construed as a "cooperative activity." It is the intent of the Parties that they shall be deemed a "single governmental unit" for the purpose of liability, as set forth in Minnesota Statutes §471.59, subd. 1a(a). For purposes of Minnesota Statutes §471.59, subd. 1a(a) it is the intent of each party that this Agreement does not create any liability or exposure of one party for the acts or omissions of any other party.

- c. Records Retention and Data Practices: The Parties agree that records created pursuant to the terms of this Agreement will be retained in a manner that meets their respective entity's records retention schedules that have been reviewed and approved by the State in accordance with Minnesota Statutes § 138.17. The Parties further agree that records prepared or maintained in furtherance of the agreement shall be subject to the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act. At the time this agreement expires, all records will be turned over to the East Otter Tail SWCD for continued retention.
- d. **Timeliness:** The Parties agree to perform obligations under this Agreement in a timely manner and keep each other informed about any delays that may occur.
- e. **Extension:** The Parties may extend the termination date of this Agreement upon agreement by all Parties.

6. Administration:

- a. **Establishment of Committees for Development of the Plan.** The Parties agree to designate one representative, who must be an elected or appointed member of the governing board, to a Policy Committee for development of the watershed-based plan and may appoint one or more technical representatives to an Advisory Committee for development of the plan in consideration of the BWSR Operating Procedures for One Watershed, One Plan.
 - i. The Policy Committee. The Policy Committee will meet as needed to decide on the content of the plan, serve as a liaison to their respective boards, and act on behalf of their Board. Each representative shall have one vote. Each governing board may choose one alternate to serve on the Policy Committee as needed in the absence of the designated member. The Policy Committee will establish bylaws within 90 days of execution of this document to describe the functions and operations of the committee(s).
 - ii. **The Advisory Committee.** The Advisory Committee will meet monthly or as needed to assist and provide technical support and make recommendations to the Policy Committee on the development and content of the plan. Members of the Advisory Committee may not be a current board member of any of the Parties.
- b. **Submittal of the Plan.** The Policy Committee will recommend the plan to the Parties of this agreement. The Policy Committee will be responsible for initiating a formal review process for the watershed-based

- plan conforming to Minnesota Statutes Chapters 103B and 103D, including public hearings. Upon completion of local review and comment, and approval of the plan for submittal by each party, the Policy Committee will submit the watershed-based plan jointly to BWSR for review and approval.
- c. **Adoption of the Plan.** The Parties agree to adopt and begin implementation of the plan within 120 days of receiving notice of state approval, and provide notice of plan adoption pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapters 103B and 103D.
- 7. Fiscal Agent: East Otter Tail SWCD will act as the fiscal agent for the purposes of this Agreement and agrees to:
 - a. Accept all responsibilities associated with the implementation of the BWSR grant agreement for developing a watershed-based plan.
 - b. Perform financial transactions as part of grant agreement and contract implementation.
 - c. Annually provide a full and complete audit report.
 - d. Provide the Policy Committee with the records necessary to describe the financial condition of the BWSR grant agreement.
 - e. Retain fiscal records consistent with the agent's records retention schedule until termination of the agreement (at that time, records will be turned over to East Otter Tail SWCD.
 - f. Provide reasonable documentation of the BWSR grant agreement to any party upon request.
- 8. **Grant Administration**: East Otter Tail SWCD will act as the grant administrator for the purposes of this Agreement and agrees to provide the following services:
 - a. Accept all day-to-day responsibilities associated with the implementation of the BWSR grant agreement for developing a watershed-based plan, including being the primary BWSR contact for the *One Watershed, One Plan* Grant Agreement and being responsible for BWSR reporting requirements associated with the grant agreement (eLINK).
 - b. Maintain information on the plan information website and perform other duties to keep the Policy Committee and the Advisory Committee informed.
 - c. Provide the Policy Committee with the records necessary to describe the planning condition of the BWSR grant agreement.
- 9. Scope of services agreements may be developed with other Parties for assistance with administration, planning, or other duties, as appropriate. Scope of services shall not exceed current fund allocations and must be consistent with any workplan or timelines developed for a grant agreement.
